Biblical Revelation & a Christian Worldview

Various professors will join in this class, Religion 226. It will be an interdisciplinary expression of our collective view on our own field of expertise with its contribution to a Christian Worldview. Each professor will address himself to some basic question in his field, such as what is time, or truth, according to the Mathematician. Each one will speak from the integrity of his own field of expertise. Each one will lead us through his remarks in one way or another to his basic understanding of part of a Christian Worldview.

It is our task as continuing members in the class:--

First: to attempt to grasp the point of view and major contribution of each professor.

Second: to join in class dialogue with purpose to clarify, (ask) any questions we may have, and to relate the contribution of each professor to our own Biblically oriented outline of revelatory data which will precede and follow the visiting professor's lecture-dialogue session.

Third: to turn in statements as follows:--

1. Turn in weekly evaluations ($\frac{1}{2}$ page, preferably typed) of class lecture-discussions, as explained in class. (Total of eight evaluations).
2. Turn in a 3-to 5-page typewritten paper on A Christian Worldview before or on May 31. (No later date is possible).

The TEXT and reading requirement is as follows:--

1. Choose any two of the following titles. Turn in an "evaluation" in terms of their value to your search for and statement of a "Christian Worldview". Has it helped you? Reflect your reaction also in your final paper-Exam, due by May 31, 1977.
2. Read about 200 pages beyond the above and report by April 28, 1977.
