1. Universalist vs. Particularist:

- 1.1 Compromise: Able to assimilate and accommodate many different cultures and races.
 - due in part to Portuguese encounters with the Moors for 8 centuries.
 - Christians, Moors and Jews developed accommodative responses to living together.
- 1.2 Laws: Laws are for others [impersonal, universally applied]. For us and our friends there are ways around the laws [personal side]. DaMatta.
- 1.3 Jeitinho. Jeito == amiability and knack for instant improvisation [Burns]. Adaptability and flexibility are encouraged because at any moment there may be a necessity or opportunity for jeito. Laws are not meant to be obeyed, but circumvented.
- 1.4 Agua no feijao que chegou mais um: openness to everyone. Hospitality means you must always accommodate one more person as he/she appears. Tolerance, acceptance of others, openness to new.
- 1.5 Religiosity: Tenha fe em Deus [trust in God]. Spiritism is widespread. Fatalism. Superstition. Tried to make everyone Catholic--surface unity of religion.

2. Ascribed vs. Achieved:

- 2.1 Status: white at top, mulatto in the middle, Indians next, black at the bottom. But Miscegenation made this a ranking system, not segregation.
- 2.2 Search for titles: men want to be a 'doctor', 'general' etc.
- 2.3 See work as demeaning. Work of slaves and servants. Order others around...
- 2.4 Fazer uma fezinha ou o Jogo da Loteria [have a little faith or play the lottery]. A desire to become rich without work, and to do so by luck, lottery or other quick gains. Get the easiest way to a solution.
- 2.5 Enjoy life: work to live through high life, carnival and festivities.
- 2.6 Palavra de Honra [love to talk]. Uninhibited in public speaking, conversing, dalogue. Enjoy talking about talking and speech.
- 2.7 Fashion: love stylish clothes and food.
- 2.8 Politics: love to be known as a great nation. Sense of national superiority.

3. Equality vs Hierarchy:

- 3.1 Hierarchy: male over female. Conquistador over local women. Miscegenation with Indian and slave women. Sense of Machismo and of exploitation and abuse.
- 3.2 Caudillo over slaves and workers. Boys raised with slave playmates and learned to be authoritarian and cruel.

4. Individualism vs Group:

- 4.1 Strong individualism; group is a temporary collective. Everyone out for themselves.
- 4.2 Search for status and prestige.
- 4.3 Hierarchy in relationships
- 4.4 Enjoy life for one's self.
